


## Before and After Pictures – Room 8, Cedar Grove ES


Beaufort Wind Scale						
Beaufort number assigned	Wind speed mph	Wind force	Wave height (feet)	Description	Effects observed on the sea	Effects observed on land
0	under 1	-	-	Calm	Sea is like a mirror	Leaves blow straight up
1	1-3	1-3	0.25	Light air	Positive with appearance of waves; no foam crests	Leaves blow in direction of wind
2	4-6	4-7	0.5-1	Light breeze	Small waves; crests of spray appear now; not breaking	Leaves on trees, bushes, and grass move; flags begin to flutter
3	7-10	8-12	2-3	Gentle breeze	Large waves; crests begin to break; scattered whitecaps	Leaves and small twigs begin to move; light flags blow down
4	11-16	13-18	21-5	Moderate breeze	Small waves, becoming larger; numerous whitecaps	Short, sharp gusts; flags begin to wave; flags
5	17-21	19-24	6-8	Fresh breeze	Moderate waves; taking larger form; many whitecaps, some spray	Small waves and small spray begin to sweep; flags
6	22-27	25-31	91-13	Strong breeze	Larger waves forming; whitecaps everywhere	Large branches of trees begin to move; umbrellas turn inside out
7	28-33	32-38	131-19	Near gale	Sea begins to white from spray; breaking waves begin to be broken in crests	Whole trees in windswept areas are bent over
8	34-40	39-46	19-25	Gale	Moderately high waves of greater regularity; spray begins to break into spindrift; foam is thrown in well-marked crevices	Wings break off trees, and roofs are torn off
9	41-47	47-54	23-32	Strong gale	High waves; sea begins to roll; spray may begin to reduce visibility	Slight damage to trees and roofs
10	48-55	55-63	29-41	Storm	Very high waves with overhanging crests; sea is covered with spray as foam; sea is brown in very heavy seas; spray is heavy and visibility is reduced	Trees uprooted; roofs damaged to houses
11	56-63	64-72	37-52	Violent storm	Exceptionally high waves; sea covered with white spray; visibility is zero	Exceptionally high waves; sea covered with white spray; visibility is zero
