MUSC 131: AMERICAN POPULAR MUSIC

A survey of American popular music from the turn of the 20th century to the present with an emphasis on rock music. Open to all students. Three hours each week. 3 semester hours

“ Upon course completion, a student will be able to:

“ Aurally identify the various styles of rock music from the 1950's to the present.

Demonstrate the ability to write and think critically about the various styles of Rock Music.

Articulate the impact of cultural and socio-political issues and its impacts on music and the listeners.

Demonstrate an understanding of the inherent value and role of a particular rock style even when it differs from personal taste.



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NUTR 101: INTRO TO NUTRITION

Study of nutrition as it relates to health and disease. Includes functions of nutrients; factors affecting nutrient intake, absorption, and utilization; and nutrient needs during the life cycle and illness. Emphasis on planning and preparing daily diets for optimal health. Course concludes by applying the principles of diet modifications to the treatment of disease. PREREQUISITE(S): A grade of C or better in MATH 080, appropriate score on the mathematics placement test, or consent of department. Assessment Level(s): ENGL 101/ENGL 101A, READ 120. Three hours each week. Formerly NF 103.

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BSAD 111: PERSONAL FINANCE

- “ An introduction to some proven techniques of financial management for the individual. Emphasis on the development of a program of financial management, including budgeting, consumer credit, consumer spending, insurance, investments in real estate, securities, commodities, income tax planning, retirement planning, and other financial problems of the individual. Assessment Level(s): AELR 930/READ 099. Three hours lecture/discussion each week. Formerly BA 211.

APPLICATION PROCESS

- “ Apply to MC today, get M# within 7-10 business days (legal name)
- “ Complete and return info sheet to Mr. Yarmus by Mon. March 16.
- “ Qualifying GPA: Juniors: 2.75 Seniors 2.5
- “ Take SAT, ACT or Accuplacer . All juniors are taking SAT March 25 (Reading 480+, Math 53+, ACT 21+) Provide Mr. Yarmus with scores.
- “ Accuplacer offered here in March/April (TBA)
- “ Prepare for SAT/ACT/Accuplacer!!

DUAL CREDIT

- “ Classes meet M/W and/or T/R during periods 7-8.
- “ Students earn 3.0 college credits and (optional) 1.0 MCPS credit per class.
- “ Credits appear on MC and MCPS transcripts, used in WGPA (unless Dual Credit is refused).
- “ Most classes count as 3.0 elective credits at MC and 4 year universities.
- “ Earn up to 24 credits before graduating high school!

HIGH SCHOOL GRANT

- “ It is highly recommended that all students complete the High School Grant Application.
- “ Eligibility for grant requires documented proof of a 2019 federal adjusted gross income of \$100,000 or less. Grant awards are based on financial need and availability of funds.
- “ For students who are eligible for free or reduced lunch, **YOU MUST COMPLETE** the free/reduced lunch form every single year to qualify for grants at Montgomery College.
- “ Grant application must be completed online. DEPA will provide link to students.

NEXT STEPS!

1. Complete and return Dual Enrollment Student Information Sheet
 - “ must be complete and returned to Mr. Yarmus by Monday, 3/16
 - “ Apply to MC, write M# down on Student Info Sheet
 - “ If student has taken SAT or ACT, turn in scores along with student information sheet
 - “ Study for upcoming SAT/ACT/Accuplacer.
2. Meet with Counselor to discuss schedule (ask them to write down your two classes that will be deleted if you are accepted in DE)

PRINTING YOUR SAT SCORES

- “ If you have taken SAT or are planning to take in the near future, you will need to print out your SAT scores in front of the Montgomery College Dual Enrollment Representative.
- “ You will have the opportunity to print it out in school when she comes to administer the Accuplacer test (TBD).
- “ High School DEPA needs a get a copy, so please follow instructions on how to print out your scores.

EXPECTATIONS

- “ This is multistep process that goes over months. It is critical that you stay on top of things.
- “ It is your responsibility to complete all the steps of the Dual Enrollment Process.
- “ Registering for Dual Enrollment requires a student to be organized. Be sure to write down/put in your phone important info like M#, MyMC ID, etc.
- “ You will need to check your MC email daily once approved.

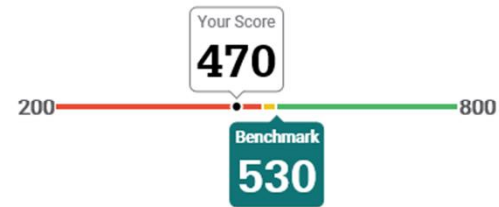

How Do My Scores Compare?
