Soon after, I went home. The second I got there, not even bothering to take my shoes off. I instantly buried my face into a pillow and tears fell from my eyes.

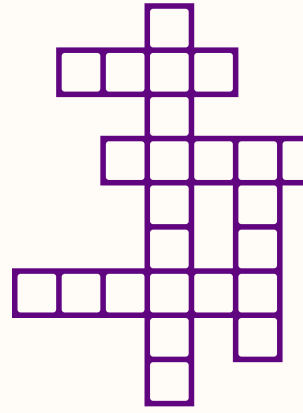
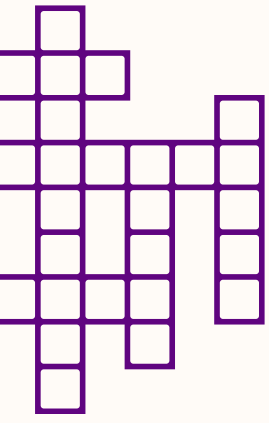

- **Participate in a park clean up near you**

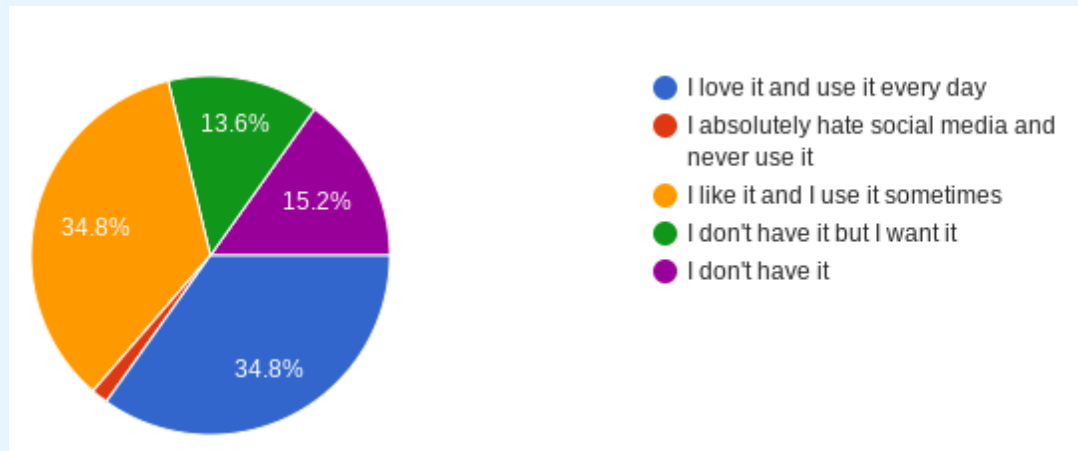
